What We're Learning 2nd Quarter

Math- Word problems to 20, balancing equations, adding and subtracting within 20, place value with base ten blocks to 99, understanding data in a bar graph, tally marks, decomposing numbers to 10, balancing equations, understanding the equal sign, finding unknown addends, and adding 3 numbers,
