#### **HAPPY NEW YEAR and WELCOME BACK!**

- This quarter, the students will be learning about the following: -Math: Word Problems, Fact Fluency, Greater Than and Less
- Than, Determining an Unknown Number, and Mentally Adding 10 More and Subtracting 10 Less. -Reading/Language Arts: Reading Fluently, Story Retell, Central
- Message, Who is Telling the Story, and Comparing and Contrasting Adventures and Experiences of Characters in Stories, Verbs, Reviewing Digraphs, Reviewing Singular and Plural Nouns, Vowel Teams, and Reviewing Silent E.
- -Writing: Opinion (stating an opinion, providing 3 reasons and examples to support the opinion, and closing with the opinion). Capitalization, punctuation, and phonetic spelling.
- **-Social Studies**: Theodore Roosevelt, Lewis and Clark, Sacagawea, Continents and Oceans, Landforms
